Her real introduction to performing came at age thirteen when she joined the choir of the prestigious Mather Academy in South Carolina, where she as a student. She remained there for four years and then went on the win several talent shows while in college and build a name for herself on the local scene.

An audition with Brian Holland led her to signing with Motown Records. Her first record, "I Can't Give Back The Love," Wright and her performance convinced Motown that it had an extraordinary find.

Though recording kept her busy, she found time to write her own songs, and like everyone else who met her, Stevie Wonder was impressed with Syreeta the singer/songwriter. But he was equally impressed with Syreeta the woman. Stevie and Syreeta eventually married and their musical collaborations, "Signed, Sealed, Delivered," "Blame It On The Sun," "It's A Shame," and "If You Really Love Me," earned plaudits from critics and the public alike.

Although the marriage did not last, this did not end their friendship nor their musical union, and their continuing working relationship yielded the highly acclaimed Stevie Wonder Presents Syreeta album. Later, when Stevie produced his classic Secret Life Of Plants LP, Syreeta penned the lyrics to and performed "Com Back As A Flower."

Syreeta's next move resulted in her first numberone record as a singer: the poignant ballad, "With You I'm Born Again," which she performed as a duet with Billy Preston. This song thrust Syreeta into the forefront of today's contemporary singers and established her as an international talent.

The true sound of Syreeta comes through on her most recent album, Set My Love In Motion. Syreeta's chemistry with producer Ollie E. Brown,
