# Neal Defends Position On West Las Vegas Charter

CARSON CITY —Sen Joe Neal last Wednesday defended his decision to include West Las Vegas in a new Las Vegas city charter, which paves the way for redevelopment efforts in blighted and crimeridden areas.

Neal's decision has been criticized by Las Vegas Assembly Democrat Gene Collins and by Las Vegas represtatives of the NAACP.

"We have been asking for redevelopment and revitalization of our area, and AB531 is a means by which this can be done", said Neal, D-North Las Veags, during a morning press conference.

Neal also denounced the NAACP's call for a national boycott of Las Vegas because of the bill creating the new charter.

"It is ridiculous to call for such a boycott on a

measure which would benefit the community," said Neal, the only black member of the Senate. "The boycott which has been called would not serve any particular purpose when we have high unemployment in our area."

AB531, a 50-page document that makes mostly technical changes, includes a provision allowing the city to target "blighted or deteriorated areas" for redevelopment by setting aside special tax districts to pay for the reconstruction.

West Las Vegas, a

West Las Vegas, a predominately black community, was amended out of the city charter by Collins, one of two black assemblymen, but was put back in the bill by Neal when the measure reached the Senate. West Las Vegas is included in both Neal's and Collin's districts.

#### Hooks reinstated to NAACP

Benjamin L. Hooks was reinstated last Thursday as executive director of the NAACP by Margaret Bush Wilson, the NAACP chairman who suspended him eight days earlier without giving a reason.

In a statement

released by the NAACP office in New York, Wilson said she reinstated Hooks because "essentially, the purposes for which the action was taken have been served, and no useful purpose will be gained by its continuance." She did not elaborate.
