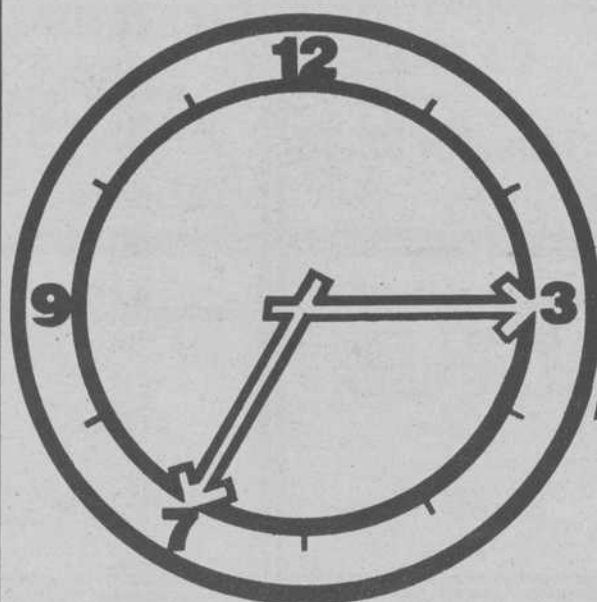

Last summer we asked you to reduce your use of electricity during peak hours — 3 to 7 PM. The effort was a success, and last year's peaks were lower than forecast.

- Turn your air conditioning thermostat up or completely off when away from home.
- Use your dishwasher and oven during non-peak hours.
- Do laundry in the morning or later in the evening.

If we all use as little power as possible from 3 to 7 PM, it'll help hold down the cost of electricity.
