
ESPN Boxing Card At Boat June 30

Jackson--headline the
six-fight ESPN boxing
card Thursday, June 30,

and Bowling Center.

Roach takes on tough Renaldo Zaragosa in a 10-rounder while Jackson faces unlightweight Ted Michaliszyn, plus undefeated junior middleweight Luis Santana.

The card, promoted by Bob Arum's Top Rank, inc., in association with the Showboat, begins at 6 p.m. with doors to the Showboat Sports Pavilion opening at 5:30.

As expected, the top four picks in Tuesday's 1983 National Basketball Association Collegiate draft went as observers had predicted, with the Houston Rockets choosing Virginia's center Ralph Sampson as the draft's No. 1 pick.

The Indiana Pacers followed by picking Missouri center Steve Stipanovich, No. 2, and the Rockets owners of the third pick, selected Louisville dunker Rodney McCray. In desparate need of backcourt help, the San Diego Clippers used the No. 4 pick to take Arizona State guard Byron Scott. However, the Chicago Bulls, picking No. 5, chose local UNLV star Sidney Green, throwing a monkeywrench into the rest of the proceedings with the surprise action. Chicago had been projected as selecting a backcourt partner for another ex-Rebel, Reggie Theus.

The remainder of the draft was a bit topsy-turvy. However most of the teams did acquire the services of very talented players that can indeed play in the NBA.

Larry Anderson, the other UNLV player eligible for the draft, was selected early in the third round by the Cleveland Cavaliers, while former Utah and Chaparral High School standout Pace Mannion was chosen in the second round by the Golden State Warriors.

Locally, in other hoop news, the annual midsummer classic, the UNLV-Alumni basketball game is scheduled for July 15 at the Convention Center with an 8:15 P.M. tipoff.

This year's encounter features the Alumni from the University of North Carolina in a rematch of the






