and dancers and later combined their talents in staging a one-hour show of original material Barbara and Vernessa showcased as song writers and vocalists and Linda and Michelle choreographed a dance routine.

Vernessa soon left the group for religious reasons, but the remaining trio has filled the gap more than adequately with powerful vocal performances and precision harmonies.

Their ambitious undertaking was well-received by the Pasadena community. They became top local entertainers, performing their show some 500 times within a year at hospital', parks, day care centers and some prisons.

Finally, Gwen Gordy, who had nurtured and honed the careers of Motown stars The Supremes, Marvin Gaye and The Spinners, heard the group and arranged an audition. The rest is history.
