

CAESARS PALACE WELCOMES THE RICHEST, POOL TOURNAMENT

Caesars Palace will host the largest purse pool tournament ever held in the history of the game, July 20 through July 26, when tavern pool players assemble at the Las Vegas resort/casino from throughout the nation to compete in the Lite Beer \$200,000 World Series of Tavern Pool.

The more than 700 contestants will engage in tough competition for the top prize money in the tournament to be

held at the world famous resort.

Unlike players competing on a professional circuit, tavern pool experts have learned the art of spinning the cue ball on coin-operated tables found in small taverns across the coun-

try. Professional pool players have mastered the game on a larger table and often find the smaller, coin-operated table awkward.

More than 9,000 tiny taverns from across the

country held the first series of competitions in February, 1983. Regional competitions were held in May to determine the final 700 players who will compete in the 8-ball and 9-ball elimination tournaments.
