


KEN'S COMMENTS



At the tiem of this writing, thirteen United States athletes have left the games and returned home. The mass exits were caused by the detection of steriod use by some of the athletes. The president of the U.S. Olympic Com-mittee, William Sinion, stated that "this is the largest expulsion of athletes in the history of inter-national competition for drug abuses." In all, 21 medals, including 11 gold medals, were disallowed. However, it must be remembered that a few of the exits were for causes other than drugs.
