Tribute Set For First Black School Principal H.P. Fitzgerald Sept. 2

A musicale has been planned for Friday night, Sept. 2, for groups and choirs of the Las Vegas area. Saturday night, Sept. 2, has been set aside to pay tribute to Huedillard Paris Fitzgerald, one of our noted blacks. He has been first in a lot of things one in particular "First Black School Principal" and the list goes on. This banquet will take place at the Landmark Hotel Main Showroom.

Fitzgerald was born in Danville, Virginia, to Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Fitzgerald, the 8th of 10 children. He completed elementary and high school and received his B.S. Degree from Virginia State College, and his Masters Degree from the University of Nevada.

The 25-year Nevada educator and school administrator is a World War II Veteran, and received the Bronze Star Medal.

Fitzgerald served as the first Black school principle in Nevada.

Fitzgerald had had a variety of firsts to his credit. Some of these are: first Black general

building contractor in Nevada, the first Black vocational education teacher in Nevada, the first Black art teacher in Nevada, the first Black to graduate from the University of Nevada, the first Black to serve on a draft board in Nevada, the first Black community college instructor in Nevada, and the first Black Employment Security Department Area Manager.

"Fitz" has served as Church school Superintendent and Trustee Board Member of the Zion Methodist Church, as a former Boy and Girl Scout Leader and Board Member, a former Economic Opportunity Board Member, former Selective Board Member, member of the Governor's Advisory Board for Mental Health and Mental Hygiene, Governor's Advisory Board for manpower training and Career Education, former City of Las Vegas Electrical Examining Board, member of the Rocky Mountain Joint Apprenticeship Committee, member of the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, member of the branch of the

NAACP, former committee member of Carpenters Local 1780 JAC, member of the Graceful Workers Committee, Seventh-Step Foundation, member of the Clark County School Integration Committee, member of the Greater Las Vegas Chamber of Commerce, Board member of Opportunity Village for Retarded persons, member of the Advisory Board, Clark

County Community College Hotel Administration, member of the board of Job Corp., SNDAC board member of several others.



FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

In II Timothy Chapter 2, verse 15, we are commanded to "Study to show yourself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth."
