have almost closed the gap in schooling and in illiteracy rates. But higher educational achievement has not paid off as well as it has for whites: 47 percent of blacks with four or more years of college earned incomes in the \$20-40,000 bracket. But so too, did the same percentage of whites with only a high school education.

There's a lot more, all of it indicating that

blacks continue to be disproportionately disadvantaged, and that the tragic black-white gap is not closing.

Some read these figures as proof that the Great Society failed. Nothing could be further from the truth. In fact, without the Great Society programs the gap would be far wider than it is and the poor of both races would be more numerous and in greater need. The Great Society programs were grossly underfunded and never reached more than a fraction of the disadvantaged. Further, they were in large part responsible for the gains blacks have made.

We've already noted a dramatic rise in black educational achievement. There has also been a marked increase in black managers and administrators, and a closing of the income gap among two-earner black families. And the black-white gap in most areas was gradually closing during the years of the Great Society programs.

The Great Society did have a profound positive effect on the black condition, but its achievements were undercut by four recessions in twelve years which have hit blacks hardest and wiped out many of their temporary gains.

Instead of beating on the Great Society, our leaders ought to be framing policies that provide employment opportunities for all and pressing for removal of discriminatory barriers that disadvantage blacks.

The continuing black-white gap is also a gap between our flawed nation and the equal opportunity society it can and should be.
