

## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK STUDY THE BIBLE

The Gospels present Christ in his three offices of prophet, priest and King. As prophet, his ministry does not differ in kind from that of the Old Testament prophets. It is the dignity of His person which makes him the unique prophet of old. God spoke through the prophets; now he speaks in the Son, Hebrews 1:1-2. The old prophet was a voice from God; the Son


does He become a foreteller of things to come. In this, Christ is at one with the other prophets. His predictive ministry follows His rejection as a King. The sphere and character of Christ's Kingly office are defined in the Davidic Covenant, 2 Samuel 7:8-16, and is interpreted by the prophets, and confirmed by the New Testament. The latter, neither (in any way) abrogates or modi-

is God Himself, Deutoronomy: 18:18-19. The prophet, in any dispensation, is God's messenger to His people; first to establish truth, and secondly, when they are in apostasy, to call them back to truth. His message is therefore one of rebuke and appeal. Only, when these fall on deaf ears, fies either the Davidic Covenant or its prophetic interpretation. It adds details which were not in the old prophets' vision.

The sermon on the mount, Matthews 5-8, is an elaboration of the idea of righteousness, as the predominant characteristic of the Messianic Kingdom,



Isaiah 11:2-5: Jerimiah 33:14-16. The Old Testament prophets were perplexed by seeing in one horizon, so to speak, the suffering and the glory of the Messiah I Peter 1:10-11. In the New Testament, these are separated by the present church age, and points forward to the Lord's return as the time when the Davidic Covenant of Blessing through power will be fulfilled. Luke 1:30-33; Acts 2:29-36. Just as the Abrahamic Covenant of blessing through suffering was fulfilled at His first coming, Acts 3:25; Galatians 3:6-14.

Christ is never called King of the church. The King is indeed one of the titles of Christ; and the church in her worship joins with Israel in exalting the King eternal, immortal, invisible. Psalms 10:16; I Timothy 1:17. But the church is to reign with Him as wife. The Holy Spirit is now gathering out - not the subjects - but the coheirs and co-rulers of the Kingdom, 2 Timothy 2:11-12; Revelations 5:10; I Corinthians 6:2-3.

The glory of all this can be known through a careful study of the Bible.


