## WELL DRESSED FEET AND LEGS . . . .

Wonderful things are happening to legs this Fall. Stockings, that come in a wide variety of textures, patterns and colors, have taken on new importance and excitement. They are so pretty, so sexy and so much fun to wear! But because there is such an array to choose from, shopping for your stockings may be confusing. Which kind is meant for work, for night-time and dress-up, or both? Which clothes go with which stockings? Which shoes are correct? Here are some examples.

These gray pin stripes, which have stepped off suits and onto legs, add sophistication to a black outfit and instant femininity to conservative suits. The stripes also make the legs look long and thin! With gray pin stripe hose, wear bright colored pumps, such as the bright red leather ones shown here. They are appropriate for work, taking the place of sheer black or natural colored ones. Team them with red, gray, brown, navy or black knits and tweeds. They are great for dressy business occasions, but not for sexy dress-up events. Never wear these sheer pin stripes with heavy boots, or bare evening shoes!

Legs can be "bright" this Fall and Winter! Jazzed up with geometric patterns, the bright red stockings shown here can perk up office darks and also make an after-five outfit look smashing! They should be worn with a well-detailed neutral shoe, which won't clash with the brightness of the stockings. They'll make any pant more feminine. Never wear the bright stockings with bright shoes, however, especially to work!

These newest scaled-down black lace and tapestry patterned hose are smashing by day or night. They should be worn with flat-finish shoes of kid, suede or patent. T-strap pumps are a terrific partner to these stockings. During the day make your gray-flannel trousers sexy by letting these black lace hose peek out with pumps. Make these hose sizzle by night with a mini- or knee-length black dress. Don't wear these stockings with a business suit or snake-skin shoes!

This Fall's menswear tweeds and longer skirts take on added elegance with these feminine knit stockings. They're a bit more expensive, but they last forever, so they're worth the cost. Wear them with shoes like these shown featuring a new heel and instep straps, which balance the weight and texture of the wool-knit hose. Oxfords go well with these stockings, too. Shoes should be of suede or calf, but not of a slicker texture like snake or patent. Wool-knit stockings go equally well with the textures of tweeds, plaids and corduroy and the flatter wools like flannels and knits. Never wear these stockings with dainty or bare shoes, like ballerinas or high-heels.
