Greater St. James Baptist Church Moves To New Building Oct. 2

On May 16, 1950, Greater St. James was organized under the leadership of the late Rev. J.L. Simons. Some of the early leaders of the church were Deacons Albert Barnes, Anderson Carr, Louis Carter, Norman Randall, William Waxey, and Floyd Payne. The Trustees were Jessie Williams, Richard Turner, and Rev. W.M. Earnest. Eddie Lofton was the secretary of the church. These leaders, many of whom are now gone, were the organizers of Greater Saint James Missionary Baptist Church.

After the death of Rev. Simons, the membership began to seek a new

leader. They decided on Rev. Ted Coveston, who served for a short time. Later they called Rev. D. Blake who led them for two years. Rev. Blake was an Evangelist who felt that he was not to remain in one place and he

gave up the pastorage to travel as an evangelist. Sometime later, Rev. Donell Horn was called to fulfill the pastor's duties and it later led to the development and construction of the new church building under his guidance.
