THE STUDY OF THE LAWS CITED IN THE BIBLE

We have found the Law of God in Exodus, 20th Chapter; the Law of the Lord in Psalms 19:7-10; the Law of Christ in Gal. 6:2. The Law of Sin, the Law of Death, and the Law of the Spirit of Life are all found in the Book of Romans 8:2.

The Royal Law: Jesus said all the laws and the prophets are fulfilled in

one word, LOVE. From the Garden of Eden, we are commanded to love one another. ADAM AND EVE: Therefore, shall a man leave his father and mother and shall cleave to his wife and the two shall be one flesh. Gen. 2:24.

CAIN AND ABEL: This is the message that we heard from the beginning, that we should love

one another, not as Cain (I John 3:11-12) but to love God, yourself, and your neighbor is the fulfillment of the TOTAL of Christendom. Everyone born of God is a Child of God. Zion Methodist Hosting Anniversary

The 1983 Anniversary Program for Zion United Methodist Church will be celebrated this week in recognition of the church's history and contributions to community life in Nevada. From the time of its establishment in 1917 to the present date, Zion Church has been active in the community's struggle for survival. Zion Church was begun as part of the Methodist Church Circuit. The first church was built in 1947 in Las Vegas. In 1967 the church built the first phase of its present structure in North Las Vegas. The facility was expanded in 1976 with an education building and formal dining room. The current sanctuary was erected in 1979. The progress of the church has been in keeping with its motto, "Building A Great Church For A Great Community."

The Anniversary Program will be characterized with worship services, varied musical renditions, sermons and recalling the history of the church. Guest ministers, choirs and friends of Zion Church will participate to fulfill a week of dedication and celebration. The following is a summary of the dates and activities of the Anniversary Program:

Thursday, Nov. 10, at 7:30 p.m., the program will be hosted by the

Women's and Youth Choirs of Zion. Guest choirs will include Grace Immanuel Baptist, Greater New Jerusalem Baptist, Greater St. James Baptist and Community Baptist Churches. The Rev. F.N. Addison will preach the sermon; he is minister of Greater New Jerusalem Baptist Church.

Friday, Nov. 11, at 7:30 p.m., program hosts will be Zion's Chancel, Gospel and Men's Choirs. The sermon will be preached by The Rev. Jessie Wesley of New Bethel Baptist Church. Guest choirs will include New Bethel, Unity Baptist and Macedonia Baptist.

Sunday, Nov. 13, at 3 p.m., this finale portion of the Anniversary Program will be hosted by the Trustee Board, Communion Stewardesses, Senior Ushers, Hospitality Board and Boy Scouts. The Church History will be presented along with music by the combined choirs of Zion. A special concert will be

rendered by the San Francisco Senior Community Choir of California. The Senior Choir is composed of senior citizens throughout San Francisco. Their purpose is to convey a spirit of sharing, participation, and loving friendship through song, and to provide unity and meaning to a largely forgotten group of elderly citizens.

In 1979 one hundred of the choir members traveled to Washington, D.C. to meet with public leaders to present concerns relating to the need for more senior housing, housing rent supplements and improvements in social security. They raised money to finance their trip through sponsoring senior talent and fashion shows.

Rev. Marion D. Bennett and Ruby Amie, Program Chairperson, invite community residents and friends of Zion Church to attend these Anniversary Program activities and celebrate with Zion members another year of service to the community and worship of God.
