

That's the likely outcome of the Administration's rigid attitude. The refusal to make reasonable compromises has convinced many that the real purpose was to destroy the Commission.

The Administration has reaped a harvest of ill-will, not only by its actions regarding the Civil Rights Commission, but by ill-considered statements and by what appears to be a persistent refusal to enforce existing civil rights laws.

Further, every time it does something decent, such as pledging to sign the bill honoring Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., it

hastens to undo it. For example, the President's gratuitous press conference remark that appeared to lend support to the ravings of rabid racists who charged Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. with communist sympathies.

He later apologized to Mrs. King, but an apology to the nation was in order. Even an apology will not undo the latest attack on civil rights the attempt to undermine the institutional integrity of federal civil rights agencies.

LAS VEGAS POST OFFICE OPENS JOB REGISTER FOR AUTOMOTIVE MECHANIC

Postmaster Joseph A. Ryan has announced that AUTOMOTIVE MECHANIC exams will be given in the near future and urgd that all those interested apply to take the job-related tests that may lead to Postal Service employment.

Salaries, not including fringe benefits, for automotive mechanic begin at \$8.38 an hour and may increase to \$9.83 an hour over an eight-year-period. Annually, this presently represents a \$16,837 starting salary for a full-time employee that increases to \$19,730 in eight years.

"I do not want to give the impression we will be hiring great numbers of people in the coming months," the Postmaster said. "I anticiptae approximately 4 vacancies will occur in the next two years that will be filled by hiring people from our job register. We need qualified people who will be willing to accept employment, and we want to offer people in the local community the chance to compete for these openings by applying for and taking the exams."
