respect and love. A very illogical development from an objective point of view.

A true ring physician is developed over many years of education; this is performed in a very subtle manner, the comet ring physician I cannot accept as a knowledgeable ring physician. In Southern California we have Drs. Roger Thill, Michael De Luca, and Bernhardt Schwartz; they have all accumulated 75 years of experience as ring physicians. They have dedicated themselves and

paid their experience dues. They must now educate others; not rely on comets who look bright, but will not endure for the welfare of the total picture.

We need this type now and we must develop others. Marty Denkin of the California Athletic Commission, Joe Olmos the Chief Inspector, and

Larry Rozadilla the present President of the Referee's Association, all take great effort in keeping the medical team integrated with each other, and with the boxing world and its rules and changes through meetings, clinics, and literature. They have made our ring physician mindful, and



to feel like part of a unique team effort.

We hope that these gentlemen will all carry on as at this time, and others will follow developing the present and future true ring physi-

cian. It is a special world with special responsibilities. A man with a medical license is not automatically qualified to speak for or deal with the complex medical aspects of boxing. He must be developed.
