# REV. JACKSON FAVORS MAN-WOMAN TICKET

Democratic Presidential Candidate Rev. Jesse Jackson said Sunday that a balanced presidential ticket should be one with a man and a woman on it, rather than one made up of two candidates chosen for their geographic backgrounds.

"I think in the future that a balanced ticket must not be based on geography or topography," he said. "The nation's not roughly half North and half South or half East and half West. It's roughly half male and half female.

"Besides, regions don't vote and women do. I think they ought to have their proper place in the political process," he said. "We're going to be true to the notion of one person, one vote. Rev. Jackson was

# SHIRLEY CHISHOLM SAYS, 'DON'T BICKER OVER JESSE."

Former U.S. Representative Shirley Chisholm the first black to seriously seek the Democratic presidential nomination, predicted last week that Jesse Jackson will control 250 or more delegates at the 1984 Democratic National Convention.

Although Jackson will be far short of the necessarv 1,966 delegates needed to win the nomination, Chisholm feels Jackson will be able to use his delegates to break a convention deadlock. She suggested that Jackson knows he won't get nominated, but he can play a crucial role at the convention. Speaking at a convention luncheon for black mayors, county and state officials, she said Jackson "understands too well the pragmatic realities" of getting the nomination. "But the question, my brothers and sisters, is to

For information on scheduling these Probe able to go to a convention for once in our lives not hanging around all the other candidates, waiting to see what crumbs will fall from the table," she said. Blacks can go to the convention "with dignity...because you have something that one of the four or five other candidates might need to be nominated."

However, a spokesman for the Jackson campaign said that Jackson was running to win. "Jackson is not in the race to be a power broker. He is in the race to win. And we do not want to estimate delegate strength because it could be more than 250," she said.

Chisholm, who has strongly criticized the role of the news media in reporting black candidates, especially Jesse Jackson, is urging blacks to try to keep disagreements away from reporters. "Don't bicker over Jesse."
