But the real test of media maturity will lie in how it covers the entire campaign. It must give Jackson's candidacy the same coverage and respect it gives to other candidates, including many who have far less of a chance to win and a lot less reason to run than Jackson does.

NAACP Announces **Image Awards Nominees**

announced the nominees for the 16th Annual Image Awards. It was revealed by the Hollywood-Beverly Hills Branch of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People that Jennifer Beals, the star of "Flashdance," is on of three nominees for the best actress category.



Half-black, half-Irish Jennifer eals is Image Award nominee.

Jennifer is probably not the first black actress in Hollywood that one thinks about. However, according to Willis Edwards, president of the Hollywood-Beverly Hills NAACP, the half-black, half Irish, olive-complexioned star wasn't nominted for her black heritage, but rather, for her depiction of a young woman from the wrong side of the tracks, who fights a hard battle to reach success (in "Flashdance" Jennier fights to be admitted to a dance conservatory).

Edwards contended, further, that the Image Awards were created to honor individuals black or white - who present a positive image for minorities.

Acknowledging the fact that Jennifer's nomination dramatizes the dearth of black actresses working in Holly-

Last week the NAACP wood, Edwards pointed out that while black actors are making slow progress against discrimination, there continues to be a "conspiracy" against black actresses.

The 1983 Image Awards ceremony will be held on Dec. 4 at the Hollywood Palladium.

Other nominees for best actress are Diahnne Abbott for her supporting role in "The King of Comedy" and Pam Grier for her starring role in the little-seen "Tough Enough." Unfortunately, as in past years, there were not enough nominees for a best supporting actress category.

Nominees for best actor are Billy Dee Williams for his role in "Return of the Jedi," Louis Gossett, Jr. for "Jaws 3-D," Yaphet Kotto for "The Star Chamber." Eddie Murphy for his role in "Trading Places," and Stan Shaw for "Tough Enough."

Best supporting actor nominees include Woody Strode ("The Black Stallion Returns"), Scatman Crothers ("Twilight Zone - The Movie"), Jim Moody ("Bad Boys") and Mark Breland ("The Lords of Discipline").

Nominees for best motionpicture are "Flashdance," "Return of the Jedi," "Jaws 3-D," "Trading Places," and "Twilight Zone - The Movie." The program will also include awards in television, theater, music and sports.
