Food gift certificates and more than 11,000 toys will be available for families Wednesday and Thursday from The Salvation Army's Community Christmas project.

Maj. Jim Sullivan said the nearly 3,000 families who have been cleared for the assistance will receive their food and toys at the Convention Center.


Volunteers from The Salvation Army Advisory Board and Women's Auxiliary will assist in the distribution of the items.

Sullivan said the toys were purchased from a wholesale company from donations received in the organization's red Christmas kettles.

Food gift certificates for Lucky Food Stores will range from \$10 to \$75, Sullivan said.

'We have purchased \$40,000 in food coupons from Lucky's and the bill for the toys was over \$22,000," Sullivan said. We have made these purchases in faith that donations in the the Christmas kettles would be adequate to cover their cost.

As of Thursday, he said, a total of \$40,000 had been raised in the kettles.
