

fine our problems in a way that is meaningful—escaping the broad, simplistic generalizations that shed no light on the problems and even block our way to solutions.

Once we see the problems clearly, we can work for realistic solutions.

In the process, hope is reborn through activism to produce policies that bring constructive change.

What kind of policies? Well, if we are concerned about hunger, we ought to be concerned about implementing policies that create jobs for those who can work and provide the essentials of life for those who cannot.

That's a way of encouraging realistic hopes for the future, since it directly attacks the problem of poverty and makes ours a better society — more fair and more just for all.

Behind both the defining of our problems and the crafting of solutions for them must lie the basic, fundamental essence of our humanity— the ability and the need to care for others.

In this Christmas sea-

son, we should be examining how we as individuals and as a society demonstrate our concern for others. Caring is the trait that helps define our humanity, and a society that does not care about its people — and people who don't care about their society or about others — are in deep trouble.

Too often we see examples of social meanness and unconcern; of brutal attitudes toward the less fortunate and the poor, that should trouble us. For the social meanness so rampant these

days is a grave weakness in our society; one that could lead to its disintegration from within.

The bonds that link each of society's members to another, whatever their differences, should be strengthened. The competition for life's rewards must not be allowed to weaken the cooperation necessary for all of us to prosper together.

As we celebrate this Christmas then, we should be mindful of the values that give it meaning, values that nations

need to adopt too, values that bind us together in caring and concern.
