## LOCAL BUSINESS GROUP RECEIVES NATIONAL SUPPORT PLEDGE

An emerging Las Vegas company has received major national recognition an a boost for its plan to enhance the local economy. The New Dawn company then coordinates the activities of all parties by aiding in site selection, land acquisition, and providing interim facility needs.

Harris, was an invited speaker at the Chicago gathering and presented the company's position. In attendance were top officers of major national businesses including the Chase Manhattan Bank, Prudential Insurance Company, Aetna Standard Insurance Company and the Ford Foundation

In commenting on the effect of this endorsement, Harris said, "The response to our ideal was outstanding. Bishop Adams assured me that we could count on the Church of Congress for help in the areas of business expertise, financial aid and entre into the international market."

## County Government To Participate In State Emergency Operations Exercise

On Jan. 13 from 9 a.m. until 11 a.m., representatives from several departments of Clark County government will gather to discuss in detail how they could coordinate emergency operations in the event of a catastrophic flood in the Las Vegas Valley. This table top exercise will be held in conjunction with a similar statewide event in Carson City by the State Division of Emergency Management and the Governor's Office.

The exercise format will be a series of hypothetical problems brought on by a major storm similar to the one

that inundated Moapa Valley two years ago. The problems will be designed to tax the County's day-to-day emergency response system and to foster an exchange of ideas between the various departments on how to best utilize existing resources to successfully cope with the situations. Some of the solutions will require state and federal resources obtained through the State government. The Clark County Radio Amateur Civil Emergency Services ham radio operators will provide radio communication to coordinate these requests
