Not long following Dr. Martin Luther King's death, someone wrote that the 20th Century will be remembered for the fact that we, in America, dared to think of the human condition as a priority. During that same period, the national mood was described by Alan Pifer, as a "broad consensus around the goal of making this society a place that conformed with the highest humanitarian and egalitarian ideals." While current trends would suggest that we have strayed from the goal, one must agree that we have witnessed some evidences of humanitarian and egalitarian ideals during the past year.

The most signal of these events was the declaration, by the United States Congress, of the "Year of the Bible." Indications of a national hunger for spiritual revival serve to support the U.S. News and World Report 1980 forecast which stated that 1)

church participation would accelerate in the 80's; 2) more people would turn to small prayer meetings; and 3) there would be greater cooperation among religious faiths. The report included a statement by Rabbi Marc Tanenbaum of the American Jewish Committee, in which he observed: "The main task of religious people in all denominations will be to mobilize the will of society to assert moral

authority over these forces that are now out of control."

It was no doubt the hand of God at work in

moving the U.S. Congress to acknowledge God as the Supreme Ruler of the affairs of our nation. I can think of no better way to "mobilize the will of society to
