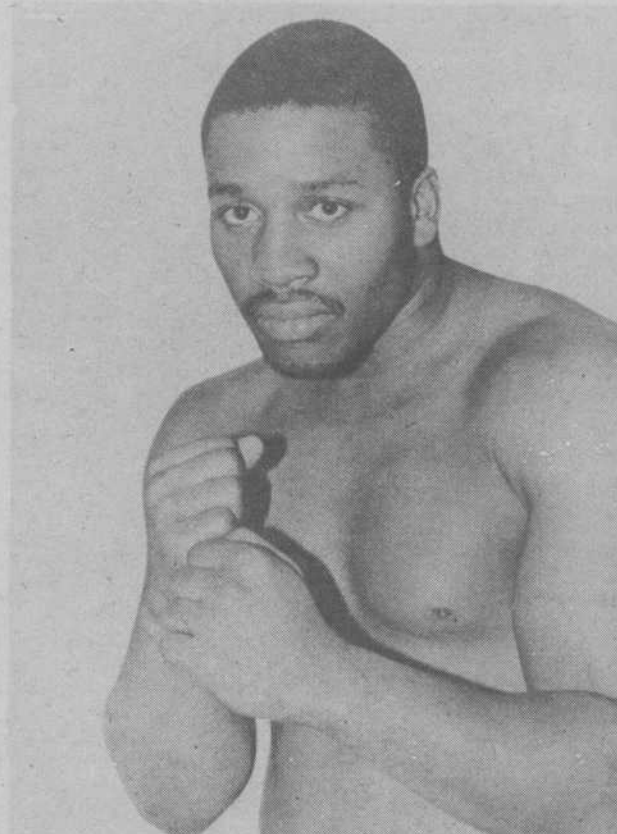

The workshop on "Procurement Opportunities" will be moderated by Otto Merida, Executive Director of the Latin Chamber of Com-

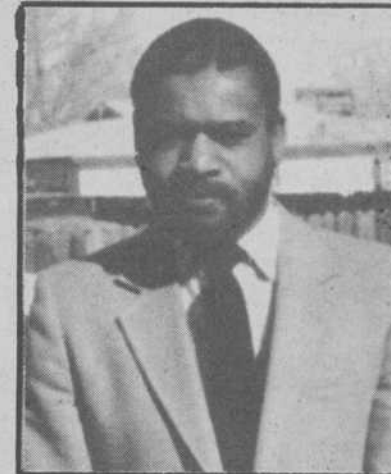
merce. A comprehensive presentation on the "what," "how," "who," and "where" of the procurement process will be made by a panel of experts on the subject, including the following:
