## Bryan Blasts Cuveston

Governor Richard Bryan earlier this week rebutted the criticism heaped upon him by the Rev. Ted Cuveston regarding a "lack of interest in the economic development of West Las Vegas" by calling him "misinformed."

Cuveston, president of the Las Vegas chapter of Operation PUSH, recently stated that the governor and other Clark County and Nevada leaders have engaged in a "systematic and deliberate program to prevent development of the Westside" here in Southern Nevada.

Bryan, in his verbal rebuttal challenged Cuveston to point out any cases where the state or the governor's office was involved in efforts to hinder development in the black community. He cited his community

meeting held in West Las Vegas last summer where he purposely brought members of his administration to the old Westside school solely for the purpose of "acquainting the leaders and citizens of programs that would be available to them." He also said an application is pending for funds from the state to help the Nevada Black Chamber of Commerce, which he said was an "indication of our administration's support."

Cuveston and other community leaders last week urged Citicorp to reconsider locating in Las Vegas and Olympic visitors to bypass Southern Nevada until some attitudes changed. Upon hearing Cuveston's remarks, Bryan simply told a reporter, "I frankly think Mr. Cuveston is misinformed."

### 11 Nabbed in Vegas Drug Bust

A raid on a Las Vegas house last Friday morning netted 11 drug-related arrests, Metropolitan Police said.

The arrests culminated a three-week investigation by narcotics agents, they said.

Narcotics detectives, SWAT and patrol officers converged at 875 Hart Street at 10:30 a.m. Friday. The people in the house had bars over the windows and had three armed guards stationed as lookouts, police said.

Only \$500 worth of free-base cocaine was recovered, but officers said other drugs were flushed down the toilet.
