According to Mel Patrick, another prominent Sigma man, "The Pan-Hellenic Council started primarily as a clearinghouse for inter-fraternal problems which arise in connection with carrying on the programs of the respective organizations." Today, however, local councils are encouraged to engage in educational and other endeavors where joint effort such as AOIP (see below) is more effective for all.

A former president expressed the importance of inter-fraternal cooperation, thusly, "We cannot escape this challenge; for within our joint constituencies there resides much of the strength of the present and much of the hope of the future."
