Las Vegas' arid climate presents unique skin problems - mainly dryness - for all skin types. Las Vegas' climate of dry heat promotes sweating and instant evaporation of moisture, causing the skin's surface to be tight and dry. The lack of moisture on the skin prevents the flow of protective sebun, a natural emollient for the skin. (Natural deposits of sebun can be seen on the scalp of newborn infants.) Treatment for this chronic dryness is the use of emollients - lubricating ingredients that soothe and soften skin and seal to prevent moisture loss due to our Las Vegas climate.

Harsh soaps can add more dryness to skin. Use inexpensive body shampoo, which lasts longer than bar cleansers, because less is needed to "suds up" and it doesn't melt in the shower or tub dish. After a good cleansing, rinse the body well. This is a very important step in maintaining skin moisture. The finishing step is applying emollients. For


applying emollients. For best results apply while the skin is still damp. Apply liberally all over the body, let emollients remain on the skin for at least 20 mins., then towel off any excess. This is one of the simplest and best known treatments for dry skin anywhere.

The emollient you use depends upon how much you want to spend and what works best for your skin type; ranging from simple petroleum jelly, cocoa butter, or almond honey lotions to name brand emollients made exclusively for dry skin.
