SENTINEL-VOICE'S "RUDI" TAKES NEW DIRECTION

"The cultural arts are very lax in creating the poet's world here in Las Vegas," says Rudi Jackson, writer of the "Jackson Street and Me" column in the Sentinel-Voice.

Rudi, who is a poet and songwriter, has decided to do something about the dearth of poetic activity here in Las Vegas. As the newly-elected Director of the Poets Workshop, he is embarking on a campaign to heighten the level of recognition and appreciation of the art of poetry and to encourage poets and potential poets to let their talents be known. It is one of his goals to greatly increase the membership of the 15member Poets Workshop, which meets once each month, usually on the last Wednesday or Thursday from 7 to 9 p.m. at the Las Vegas Library, 1727 East Charleston Blvd. in the Charleston **Shopping Mall.**

Rudi and the other members of the Poets Workshop are available to do poetry readings for parties, meetings, schools, churches, colleges and social organizations. While they usually charge a nominal fee for this service, they sometimes give free readings for special groups.

Actually, poetry reading is not new to Rudi. He has been writing and reading his poetry for many years, ever since he started participating in the Watt's Writers Workshop in Los Angeles. When he checked his records not too long ago, he was surprised to discover that he has given over 35 readings of his poetry right here in Las Vegas over the past 10 years. During this past year, his talent has been increasingly in demand and he has found himself reading for many church and social groups. He has also read his poetry on radio stations KCEP and KUNV and at Clark County

Community College and UNLV. During February he was the guest performer for the prestigious Afro-American Cultural Services Banquet, which was held in the Student Union Ballroom at UNLV. This latter engagement was especially appropriate since his favorite poetic subject to write about happens to be "the women of the world" and that banquet was in honor of 33 outstanding black women of Las Vegas.

This past Easter Sunday Rudi read his poetry at the Senior Citizens Easter Banquet, which was held at the Union Plaza Hotel. This coming Saturday, April 28, he and other workshop poets will read at the Special Open House program at Reality House.

Since business is picking up so well, Rudi intends to branch out into more poetry reading on his own. Brochures are being sent out to churches, schools and organizations in other cities and states, making his availability known. Eventually, he hopes to get on the tour circuit with his presentation. Hampton Reese is managing Rudi in this endeavor and Clarence Morgan, who has done PR work for Niki Giovanni, among others, is handling Rudi's Public Relations

In addition to all this, Rudi continues to write. especially poetry. A very prolific person, Rudi has all in all penned over 100 songs and 300 poems, not to mention many short stories and other writings. Eleven of his songs have been recorded with success, among them "Angel In My Life,' "Oh, Yes I Know," "How," and "Hearts of Stone," which was his biggest hit. In the past he has managed several recording groups and once sung in a group.

Presently, Rudi is working on several new poems and has completed a book of poetry,
