


REGGIE JACKSON

NEW, CHALLENGING MINT 400 COURSE PLANNED

With more than half of the always grueling Mint 400 race course new this year, the 1984 version of the world's richest and largest off-road race is expected to be even more challenging.

The 17th annual race, staged and organized by Del Webb's Mint Casino/ Hotel, will be run Saturday, May 5, beginning at 9 a.m. at Las Vegas International Speedrome.

"It will be a typical Mint 400 course — tough, dusty and constantly changing," said Race Director K.J. Howe.

Howe said the course was altered substantially this year to avoid a large section run in previous years on land owned by the Moapa Band of Paiute Indians. Howe and Race Advisor Walt Lott recently mapped out a new route, with approval from the Bureau of Land Management, that includes more than 50 percent which has never been raced on before.

"That should make it particularly challenging this year," said Lott.

Race officials also said the infamous "Rock Garden" which eliminated many entries in past years was lost but an area "equally as rough" is taking its place. Many areas near the course are closed to spectators, and fans are urged to check maps available in the Mint 400 program to avoid areas that could be particularly sensitive to off-road
