
HERITAGE HALL OFFICIALLY OPENS MAY 24-



Heritage Hall, located in The Nucleus Plaza Shopping Center, officially opens at noon, Thursday, May 24, with a ribbon cutting ceremony headed by County Commissioner Woodrow Wilson. Coordinating the opening activities will be Leonard Brown, Director of Community Activities at Heritage Hall.

Having already achieved some historical "firsts," since its prerenovation opening a year ago, Heritage Hall was established to answer the growing needs for a community-based facility in West Las Vegas, to accommodate special events for families, churches, businesses and organizations," she continued.

"The 12,000 sq. ft. of space, named Heritage Hall, faces West Owens Ave. and is nestled in the center of the shopping plaza.

Heritage Hall will not only become the "heart-beat" of West Las Vegas' only commercial shopping center, but will serve to greatly enhance the overall image of the community by a tangible symbol of pride and growth.

Bill Bemis of Design Consortium combined modern architecture and interior design in a renovation plan for the allnew interior, to include: a multi-purpose auditorium with stage, dance floor, dressing rooms, drop ceiling, floor and wallcoverings, sound system and lighting and a new facade."

Nucleus Plaza, Inc. principals view Heritage Hall as a vital component of the community development process. Leonard Brown, Executive Director of Nucleus Associates, LDC stated: "... It will enhance community life through a physical and spiritual revitalization of the neighborhood."

Since its temporary opening, Heritage Hall will be remembered by hundreds of happy children who attended the first community-wide Christmas party sponsored by Nucleus Plaza. During a week of programs, marking the 35th Annual Holy Convocation of the Churches of God in Christ, over 3,000 gathered at Heritage Hall. "It will be a place for everyone to have their next big activity and we have left no stone unturned when it comes to conveniences, space, and atmosphere. It has a unique sound system. It is a place where one can hold their public meetings, seminars, banquets, church activities, social functions and a host of others.
