Blamed: increased expenses. Reno casinos had big gains, but profits were down in Las Vegas and losses were recorded in Lake Tahoe . . . Civil Rights Suits Filed In Court

RENO - Attorney Robert Hagar has filed two more civil rights suits against Winnemucca and its police department.

Both were filed in federal court at Reno. One on behalf of Deborah Betts of San Francisco seeks \$500,000 actual damages and \$100,000 punitive damages resulting from an incident in January 1982. She was charged with running a red light and resisting arrest. She alleges officer Michael Veitch used unnecessary force, harassment, verbal abuse, threats and other abuse of her civil rights.

In the other suit, a prostitute who worked in Winnemucca in July 1982 claimed damages for alleged violations of
