

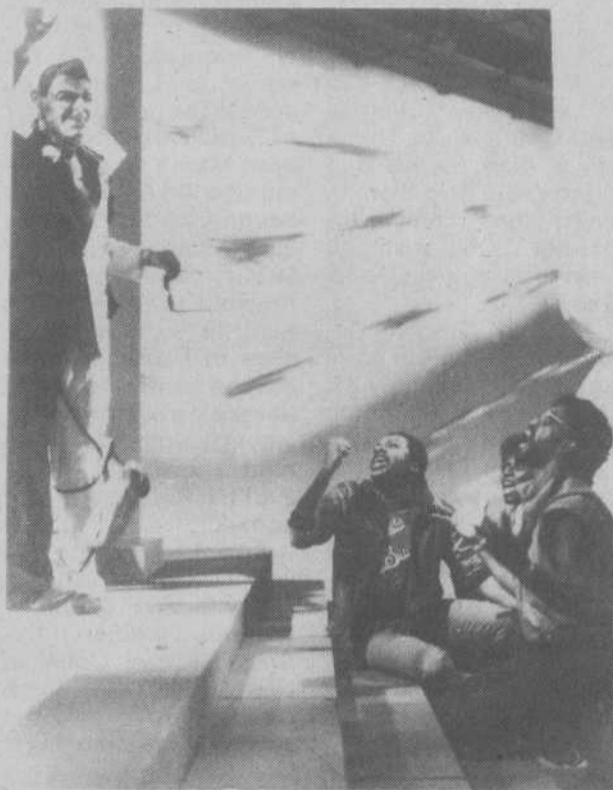

CAMEO Shoots Hit Video

Atlanta, Ga.—Atlanta Artists/Polygram recording group, CAMEO, has just completed the shooting of a new video at Atlanta's Georgia Pacific Studios to coincide with the release of their second single, "Talking Out The Side Of Your Neck," from their No. 1 album, *She's Strange*.

"Talking Out The Side Of Your Neck" is a political song which stirs the feelings and apprehensions shared by millions of people concerning the questionable ethics being practiced in our nation's system today. "You know how everyone complains about the job not being done in Washington," CAMEO explains. "And in some ways they're right. But the average American doesn't get the chance to voice his opinion and have it broadcast across the national airwaves. So we decided to take the people's message and put it to music."

The video is directed by veteran producer, Dee Trattman, of MGMM Productions in London, England. Trattman's past work includes clips for Duran-Duran, The Eurythmics and The Thompson Twins, as well as CAMEO's last

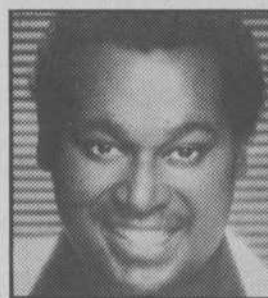
"ANOTHER LUCKY NITE"—BUT FOR AMERICA

WASHINGTON, D.C. — It was several lucky days and nights for America recently when the Joe Louis Memorial Committee, co-chaired by Jersey Joe Walcott and Sugar Ray Leonard, payed 4 days and 3 nites of tribute to the immortal heavyweight. The first round was in the Mayor's office, where Mrs. Martha Louis was presented a proclamation declaring May 11th "Joe Louis Day." Natch that ceremony was on the 10th. The second round, May 11th, a large contingent from several sections of the country, lead by Mrs. Louis, Joe's kids and kin and Freddie Guinyard,

his long-time personal aide, made it to the White House. There, President Ronald Reagan presented the champ's widow with a gold medal-coin which had been struck in his honor. Originally scheduled for the Oval Office, this ceremony had to be switched to larger quarters of the pale house to accommodate the expanded guest list. Another hi'lite of the tribute wk'end was a continuous film festival at the Frederick Douglass Museum depicting important facts about the life of Joe Louis and his greatest fights.
