Loring Baker of Atlanta, the President of the USA/ABF will chair the selection committee. Other members of the committee include representatives from the military, the USA/ABF international committee, the Olympic coaching squad, Golden Gloves and former Olympic champions.

The United States now boasts several world champions, who have led the sport in their weight divisions. Among the world

champion Americans is Floyd Favors in the 119 lb. weight class who holds three world championship titles - 1982. 1983 and 1984. He is from Capitol Heights, Maryland and captured the third place award in the 1983 Pan Am Games, having won the Pan Am trials that same year.


Competing in the 147 pound category, Mark Breland is a three-time world champion, having won the title in 1982, '83 and '84. A talented athlete from Brooklyn, N.Y., Breland is the 1983 US Champion and was selected Boxer of the Year in 1982 and 1983. Only 21 years old, he also starred in a motion picture called "The Lords of Discipline,' appearing as the first black student to be admitted to a military academy.
