HOME REBUILDERS SHOOT FOR 1.000

Building Trades preapprenticeship trainees assigned to the Westside Community Development Commission plan to refurbish and redecorate at least 61 homes in Las Vegas between July 1, 1984 and June 30, 1985. This will bring to 1,000 homes the more than 975 trainees who have participated in the organization's Minor Home Repair Services Program have refurbished between 1977 and 1985 in Las Vegas.

The trainees repair homes for widows, senior citizens, the handihomeowners. All labor is free, and the workers have saved the homeowners more than \$1,000,000 during this period.

The training program covers all phases of basic home construction and repair, such as carpentry, roofing, painting,

Many of the program graduates have entered the construction industry, and some have formed their own painting contracting businesses.


