Postal money orders are a safe, convenient way to send funds through the mail. They're as good as cash, but you can mail them without a moment's worry—if they're lost or stolen, your receipt guarantees replacement. You can purchase a postal money order in any amount up to \$500, and the service charge is small. So if you need to mail anything from a few dollars to a small fortune, your best bet is to bank on the post office.
