Vo-Tech-Constructed House Still Looking For A Buyer

A house constructed by last year's carpentry class at Southern Nevada Vocational-Technical Center rests on its temporary foundation in the school's parking lot — unsold after two attempts this summer.

For the first time anyone can recall since the house became an annual project for Vo-Tech carpentry classes, there has not been any takers. With a new school year just underway, the challenge is to find a buyer, and soon!

"It's actually a fantastic bargain at a minimum bid price of only \$21,800," says Vo-Tech principal Mario Monaco. "The house is built solid as a rock with extra everything, down to the plumbing and hand-finished cabinetry," he added. "I can't think of a wiser investment for someone looking to improve an undeveloped lot," said Monaco.

In accordance with state law, the house has to be sold at public auction. So, the Clark County School District is looking to make the third attempt a charm. Sept. 15, 9 a.m. is the new date to auction off the house, along with three 8x10 ft. storage sheds, also built by the carpentry students.

The three-bedroom, one and 3/4 bath house contains close to 1,300 sq. ft. of living space. The buyer is responsible for relocating the house to a permanent site. Proceeds from the sale of the house are already earmarked and badly needed to buy building supplies for this year's carpentry class.

Prospective bidders may inspect the house any weekday at Vo-Tech, 5710 Mountain Vista, 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. The front door key can be picked up in the principal's office.


