# City Seeks Bids For Cashman People Mover

Councilman Ron Lurie announced that the City has invited all qualified companies to submit a proposal to develop an elevated automatic people mover system between the Cashman Field Complex and the site of the old Fire Station #1 located at Casino Center Blvd. and Stewart St.

The Request for Proposal for the ultramodern people mover is a 155-page document that details the work required and both the City's and the successful bidder's responsibil-

"This is a very detailed document," Lurie stated, "and we are expecting responses from some very high-powered, internationally- stated. recognized firms."

The scope of work calls for complete engineering, design, construction, operation and maintenance of an elevated people mover system at no cost to the City of Las Vegas.

Extensive communication with numerous firms has made us "confident that private industry can build and operate this sytem at no cost to City taxpayers," Lurie

"Although the proposal calls for no direct City costs, the City will be very much involved with development of the project and will assist the successful bidder to the greatest extent possible," Lurie added.

The people mover project is one portion of a three-phase Downtown Transportation Project that has received the full support of the Mayor and City

Councilmen. The entire project is viewed by the City Council as a posi-

tive step towards significantly improving mass transportation in the downtown area.

The other two phases of the project included conversion of Fire Station #1 into a transportation center, and acquisition of motorized theme trolleys to circulate among the downtown area.

### MT. CHARLESTON CAMPGROUNDS CLOSING

The U.S. Forest Service announced today that it will be closing its camp and picnicgrounds on Oct. 1, 1984 for the winter season. All sites, including group reservation areas, will be gated closed except for

Kyle Campground in Kyle Canyon and Deer Creek Picnic Area on Deer Creek Highway. Both sites will be available at no charge through the winter; however, no water or trash services will be provided. Visitors are also reminded that even after sites are closed. campfires, stoves, and charcoal may still be restricted until the fire danger is decreased.

District Ranger Bob Wize explained the site closures: "Our visitor use rapidly declines after Labor Day, to the point where it is not economical to keep them open. The water systems must be drained due to freezing night temperatures. During this time we winterize the water systems, and make needed repairs before winter sets in."
