percent of eligible voters. The government's attempt to drive a wedge between black Africans and their non-white counterparts has demonstrably failed.

Recent economic trends also suggest that South Africa is in for a period of greater black worker unrest. In 1982, for example, while white earnings (already more than 4.5 times those of blacks) rose, the average black South African workers' earnings fell by 7 percent.

Yet despite the economic and political setbacks visited upon black South Africans, despite the suppression of black trade unionists, despite the brutality of the police in combatting demonstrators, there has been no public expression of outrage or criticism from President Reagan.

When he assumed the Presidency, Ronald Reagan inaugurated a policy of "constructive engagement" with the racist regime in Pretoria. The stated purpose of this policy was to convince the government of P.W. Botha to move toward resolving the question of Namibian independence and to encourage the government to take concrete steps toward increased representation for blacks, Asians, and "coloureds."

Now, nearly four years after the launching of the new course of cordial relations between the Reagan Administration and South Africa it is clear that "constructive engagement" has yielded nothing for South Africa's blacks.

If President Reagan indeed was sincerely pursuing the policy of "constructive engagement" with the goal of encouraging the South African government to move toward improved conditions for blacks, it is time that he acknowledge that this policy has failed. It is high time, as well, that the role of the U.S. in combatting apartheid become a matter of debate between the Presidential candidates.
