

Rebels blast 49ers, 41-23

UNLV Rebels last Saturday blew out the Long Beach 49ers in a key Pacific Coast Athletic Association game at Long Beach, 41-23.

The Rebels, in perhaps their finest showing in Harvey Hyde's two and a half seasons of coaching, stormed back from a 14-0 first quarter deficit and blasted the 49ers.

"It wasn't revenge, just a sweet win," said Hyde, referring to last year's bitter 24-21 defeat to Long Beach State that cost UNLV the league championship.

The victory moved the Rebels to 3-0 in the conference and kept the team in sole possession of first place.

A balanced offensive attack, led by 100-yard rushing performances from Kirk Jones and Tony Lewis, and three touchdown passes from Randall Cunningham, wore down the 49ers in the second half. It was then that the Rebels broke open a 17-17 tie.

UNLV outscored the 49ers 41-9 in the final three quarters and that would have been worse

had Long Beach's Sheldon Gaines not broken clear for a 95-yard kickoff return midway through the final period.

We turned it around in the second quarter when we started gambling," said Hyde. "We had to make something happen."

It was an afternoon Rebel players could pad their statistic totals. UNLV picked up 434 yards in total offense, Harvey Allen and Damon Perry recorded interceptions and Cunningham punted for a 50-yards per kick average.

Still, it was an afternoon for Jones' longawaited homecoming.

UNLV vote in pre-season poll

The Sporting News Tuesday chose DePaul as the nation's top college basketball team going into the 1984-85 season and voted UNLV to the No. 10 pre-season spot.

The other top 10 teams, in order, are Georgetown, Illinois, Duke, Memphis State, Southern Methodist, Indiana, Oklahoma and Washington.

DePaul's coach this year is Joey Meyer, son of former coach Ray Meyer, who retired after last season.

The Sporting News says DePaul faces a

tough schedule, which should give the Blue Demons the strength they need to make it to the Final Four.

Rounding out the top 20 teams, in order, are Georgia Tech, Louisiana State, Syracuse, Michigan, St. John's, Kansas, Virginia Tech, North Carolina, Kentucky and Villanova.

DePaul is the only independent in the rankings. The Big East has the most representatives with four teams, while the Big 10 and the Atlantic Coast conferences have three teams each.

SAN ANTONIO, TX. Calvin Peete, exhibiting his accuracy for reaching the green, shot a final-round 4-underpar 66 for a 266 total and a three-shot victory Sunday in the Texas Open golf tournament.

Peete, the most successful black player the game has produced, also took a commanding lead in the race for the coveted Vardon Trophy, which goes to the man with the low stroke average on the Tour - a 70.56 average - 0.17 ahead of Craig Stadler with three weeks remaining in the season.

Peete claimed the eighth title of his PGA Tour career, and his first of the season, with a 266

total, 14 strokes under par on the Oak Hills Country Club course that was soaked by a heavy morning rain.

The victory was worth \$63,000 from the total purse of \$350,000 and increased Peete's season's earnings to \$232,124 for the year.

Peete, who began the

day leading the field with a 10-under 200, fired four birdles on the day for the tournamentlow 14-under 266.

Jim Colbert of Las Vegas, who led by three shots at the halfway mark, faded to a fourover 74 Sunday and finished at 277, 11 strokes behind Peete.
