Dr. West, first black Nevada doctor, newspaper pioneer, dead

Dr. Charles I. West, 76, the first black physician to be licensed in the State of Nevada and a longtime community leader, died Sunday night at Valley Hospital.

Born in Washington, D.C., Sept. 27, 1908, Dr. Charles I. West was the youngest of the four children of Dr. and Mrs. Charles West, Sr. Like his father, Dr. West, Jr. was a graduate of the Harvard University Medical School. His mother, Rebekah, was the first Black principal in the Washington, D.C. school system.

Dr. West completed high school at the Williston Academy for Boys in East Hampton, Massachusetts and began his colege years at Dartmouth College where he was a classmate of the late former Vice-President, Nelson Rockefeller. He graduated from medical school in 1933 and completed his internship at a Kansas City hospital after which he became the resident surgeon at a Tulsa, Oklahoma hospital.

A graduate of the Harvard University Medical School, Dr. West began his college years at Dartmouth College where he was a classmate of the late former vice-president Nelson Rockefeller. His mother, Rebekah, was the first black principal in the Washington, D.C. school system.

Dr. West served in World War II as a field surgeon and was wounded in France.

After his discharge from the military, he studied at the London Tropical School of Medicine.

Before returning to the United States, Dr. West traveled to Liberia, West and published the Las

plishments, Dr. West had been president of the Voters League and served on the executive board of the NAACP. A black medical society was named in his honor in 1979.

Dr. West was also a delegate to the Democratic Party national convention when John F. Kennedy was nominated for President of the United States.

Dr. West, who was afflicted with emphysema, lived in retirement for the past several years, enjoying the weekly sessions of his bridge club (called "The Group") and taking an occasional cruise with Dottie and close friends. He had only recently returned from a cruise to Alaska when felled by the illness which brought on his death.

Survivors include his wife, Dottie, two sons, Dr. West, a medical officer in Reno, and Rocci, a sister, Charlotte Strickland and her husband, Dr. William Strickland of Philadelphia, a grandson, Shaun West, two
