### Eldridge Cleaver angry after arrest

Former Black Panther leader Eldridge Cleaver, running as a Conservative for city council in Berkeley, Calif., was angry Sunday over his arrest for violating a restraining order in a housing dispute.

"It's the first and only time I've ever been arrested in the city of Berkeley in my whole life," Cleaver, 49, said.

"One of the things I've been saying in my campaign speeches is I've never been arrested in Berkeley.

"I consider this to be a devious, underhanded, politically inspired move," the radical-turned-writer said.

Cleaver, who spent an hour locked up at the police station, said he'll talk to his lawyer today about filing a complaint.

He faces a Oct. 30 court hearing for the incident, in which Cleaver and Karen Koelker were

trying to help 76-year-old Clara Morrison return Saturday to her home. The home was rented out by a relative while Morrison was in a retirement home.

Cleaver, who called for revolution in his 1960s book, *Soul On Ice*, fled the USA in 1968 to avoid charges of assault and attempted murder after a shoot-out between Black Panthers and police in Oakland, Calif.

He returned in 1975, describing his conversion to Christianity in *Soul On Fire*.

He may never have been arrested in Berkeley before, but he recounted arrests in Havana and Algiers for "disobeying dictators."

He also recalled arrests in Los Angeles and Oakland. And the charges? "I don't remember, man."
