velop jobs. The job is going to have to be done by us - the people who live here." He also said that he is going to ask every member of the Board to share and work. We need to broaden the base of the Black Chamber of Commerce. There are many Black businesses all over the city. We want everyone to become a part of the Chamber. All are welcome to become members of the NBCC. Minorities, non-minorities,

Asians, Latin Americans. All are welcome.

Bailey said, "It is ridiculous to live in a city that exists off of the gaming industry and not have a piece of the business. It is absolutely ridiculous. We are going to be looking into the revitalization of Jackson Street. Nevada Black Chamber of Commerce is going to work with the Jackson Street businessmen. You don't believe it can happen. are working on

bringing new business developments."

"We want to attend the North Las Vegas City Hall meetings. We want to have a watch-dog community. We are going to request from our political representatives that they are going to work with us. We must focus on the **Economic Development** in providing jobs. We are going to look at the legislative level. You are going to be accountable.'

Bailey said that some people do not like to come on the Westside because they are afraid. He said, "There is no more that happens to you over here than at Caesars Palace. We are going to change our thinking. We must change that image. What is that about being afraid to go on Jackson Street?"

"We must network with the greater Las Vegas Chamber of Commerce, the Latin American Chamber of Commerce; we must network with the Pacific Asian Chamber of Commerce. We need to protect the consumer. Have some watchdogs."

He said he will be dealing with member-

ships and finances. The goal is 100 new members for next year.
