

DR. MARY FRANCES BERRY TO LECTURE HERE

Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, assisted by the National Conference of Christians and Jews, Love All People, Clark County Community College and the Department for Academic Advancement of the University of Nevada, Las Vegas, will sponsor "Re-Energizing Education for the 21st Century," a program featuring Dr. Mary Frances Berry, Saturday, Feb. 16 at Clark County Community College.

This program is funded by the Nevada Humanities Committee and is free and open to the public.

The 1985 program will be held in two sessions - morning, 8:15 a.m. to 1

p.m. and evening, 7 p.m. to 8:30 p.m.

The morning session will consist of four workshops:

The Beginning: Early Childhood Education; Effective Intervention: Parenting skills; Keeping Pace: Vocational Training; and The Content of Education.

At the evening session, Dr. Berry will lecture on the theme, "Re-Energizing Education for the 21st Century." Further, she will comment on questions from the audience as related to the above theme and her past experience.

Dr. Berry was born in Nashville in 1938. She received both her B.A. and

M.A. degrees at Howard University in 1961 and 1962. Now at the top of her profession, Dr. Berry studies and teaches history and law in a bit more realistic, and more sobering fashion than the traditional sugar-coated versions we all grew up with. She is currently a Professor of History and Law and a Senior Fellow in the Institute for the Study of Educational Policy at Howard University.

In addition to her teaching, she serves as a Commissioner on the U.S. Commission on Civil Rights, and was Vice-Chairperson from 1980-1982. She served as U.S. Assistant Secre-

tary for Education in the Department of Health, Education and Welfare. Dr. Berry has held faculty appointments at six major universities. In addition to doctorate and juris doctorate degrees, she has received 10 honorary degrees in

recognition of her outstanding work.

the economic mainstream and those outside. Roger Wilkins, a Studies, will be the moderator, as a panel of six prominent Black.

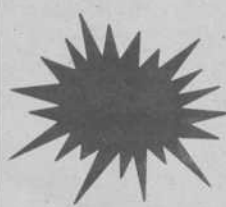

7 apply for school seat

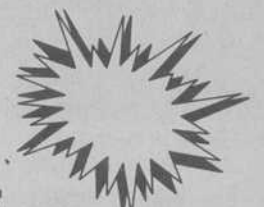
Seven people have applied to fill the vacant Clark County School District Board of Trustees District C seat formerly held by Virginia Brewster.
