Dr. Berry was born in Nashville in 1938. She received both her B.A. and M.A. degrees at Howard University in 1961 and 1962. Now at the top of her profession, Dr. Berry studies and teaches history and law in a bit more realistic, and more sobering fashion than the traditional sugarcoated versions we all grew up with. She is currently a Professor of History and Law and a Senior Fellow in the Institute for the Study of Educational Policy at Howard University.

In addition to her teaching, she serves as a Commissioner on the U.S. Commission on Civil Rights, and was Vice-Chairperson from 1980-1982. She served as U.S. Assistant Secre-

tary for Education in the Department of Health, Education and Welfare. Dr. Berry has held faculty appointments at six major universities. In addition to doctorate and juris doctorate degrees, she has received 10 honorary degrees in
