
Easter Run set for April 6

In what began as a showcase for All-American performer Georgetown's Patrick Ewing, along with a contingent that featured St. John's Chris Mullin and Memphis State's Keith Lee, ended with a true demonstration of what hard work plus desire can obtain.

For the second time in the last three years, the underdog came up with a stellar effort as, before 24,000 fans and a nationwide television audience. Rupp's Arena in Lexington, Kentucky, played host to the 1985 NCAA Championship contest. When the

hoopladied, a small school located outside Philadelphia stood alone.

The Villanova Wildcats stunned all observers by playing mistake-free hoop, to dethrone the defending national champion Hoyas by a score of 66-64, to capture its first ever title, thereby jetting the previously unranked squad in the country's top spot.


Not even on the board in one Las Vegas Sport's Book, the 25-10 Wildcats upset Georgetown which had hoped to become the first club since UCLA ended a seven-year reign in 1973, to repeat as titlists.

While scoring one of the most dramatic victories in college basketball history, Villanova shocked George town by shooting a NCAA

championship record. From a television standpoint, the Georgetown-Villanova matchup was a huge success, as the Hoyas had become involved in a love-hate relationship with fans, pushing some of them to the side of the Wildcats.

The NCAA and CBC combined forces to present a spectacular package which is expected to net some \$29,000,000 with each Final Four team being guaranteed \$708,000.

With the Wildcats pulling off the unthinkable, Villanova has sealed a space in many minds, while Georgetown must be considered for a true standout.
