Retroactive pay for teachers may pass in Senate, Assembly lags

CARSON CITY - Retroactive pay for school teachers and classified edcation personnel would pass in the Senate but needs four more votes to pass the Assembly, a recent poll of Nevada legislators shows.

The poll, taken by the Nevada State Education Association and published in its newsletter Friday. states 14 senators are in favor of the retroactive pay increase for elementary and secondary school teachers, with one senator leaning for the increase, two undecided, one leaning against and three against.

On the Assembly side, 18 lawmakers, including four Republicans, are for the \$17 million retroactive pay increase. Eleven are undecided, one is leaning against the plan, and 12 are against it.

The hitch in the Assembly side, however, may be in the Ways and Means Committee, in which a poll taken Assemblyman Bob Thomas, R-Carson City, showed the eight Republicans on that panel, which would review the appropriations bill for the increase, oppose it.

Identical bills for the retroactive pay increase are expected to be introduced in the Senate and Assembly Monday, sponsored by Sen. Thomas 'Spike' Wilson, D-Reno, and Assemblyman Marvin Sedway, D-Las Vegas. The Senate version was signed on by all Senate Democrats and

Republicans Ray Rawson of Las Vegas and Sue Wagner of Reno.
