Secretary T. H. Bell announced today that the Department of Education has established a continuing working relationship with the Assault On Illiteracy Program (AOIP) in a concerted effort to carry out the National Adult Literacy Initiative announced by President Reagan last September.

AOIP is a framework which allows national Black organizations to work together to encourage Black Americans to improve their literacy skills. They have united to focus their considerable strength and expertise on youth and adult literacy.

In a recent workshop, members of the AOIP, who represent national Black organizations, and senior Department officials met to discuss strategies for solving problems of illiteracy in the Black community. AOIP has called the workshop an historic example of cooperation between the Federal government and Black Americans.


The Secretary this week is sending to all 50 State governors letters emphasizing that one of the goals of AOIP is to work with literacy groups at the State and local levels and to organize State and local AOIP chapters.

In the letter, the Secretary said, "Attention must be given to the unique aspects of the problem of illiteracy among Black Americans for whom the rate of functional illiteracy has been estimated at approximately three times that among White Americans."

As the Department's Regional Offices coordinate plans for involving Federal employees in literacy programs, they will call upon the resources of AOIP. The Secretary also informed the governors that the Department's regional staff will be available, upon request, to assist the States in working with organizations on literacy efforts.

AOIP receives invitations to participate in meetings and conferences that address the National literacy efforts and meet with members of Congress about the level of funding for Black Americans in the Adult Education Act.

Secretary Bell said, "The Department will continue its cooperative efforts with AOIP as they begin their community-building approach toward literacy promotion. Literacy affects too many of our citizens for one group to tackle it alone. These organizations represent a valuable source of volunteers for literacy."
