

## Lillette Jenkins To Be Presented in Concert By Links

"An Evening of Enchantment" will be presented by the Las Vegas Chapter of Links, Inc., at the home of Dr. Lonnie Hammargren, on May 18. This Spring Gala, which is the major event of the year to be sponsored by the Links, will feature dynamic Lillette

Jenkins in concert. The concert, which will begin at 8:30 p.m., will be preceded by cocktails at 7:30 p.m. Dancing and hors d'oeuvres will follow the program.

A widely known performer, Lillette Jenkins is a classical, jazz, and gospel

pianist, organist, teacher, composer, and arranger. She was born in New York, and is a graduate of Wadleigh High School, New York University, and Westminster Choir College.

She serves as Minister of Music and Conductor for several concert choirs. Her credits include four years as Music Director for the off-Broadway hit musical production "ONE MO' TIME", two years as the actress portraying the night club pianist on the daytime drama "ALL MY CHILDREN", and an appearance in the recently released movie "COTTON CLUB". She hosted her own jazz variety show in Detroit, Michigan, and has performed in schools, churches, concert halls, and jazz festivals in Europe and Africa, as well as nationwide.

In addition to teaching for seven years in the public schools of New York, she also works in the field of Music Therapy, conducting music sessions for nursing homes and senior citizen centers. She is presently the Director of her own School for the Performing Arts in Fairfax, Virginia, where her daughter lives and serves as administrator.

Almost 20 years ago, the Las Vegas Branch of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People moved its office to the, then, Golden West Shopping Center in the heart of West Las Vegas.

About 3 years ago, under the presidency of Rev. James Allen, the Branch office relocated to 1500 No. Main Street. There, the Branch remained until January 15, 1985.

After my election as President, the Branch was moved to a temporary home in the old OIC Building located at 1000 No. "D" Street. Since January, the office furniture remained packed until April 26, when it was finally moved to its present address . . . 940 West Owens, Suite A.

When I arrived in Las Vegas in the month of July 1970, the NAACP was housed in the old Boys Club in the Golden West Shopping Center, next door to Attorney Charles Kellar's office.

I was hired as Executive Director of this Branch during the administration of Attorney Kellar. I also served during the presidencies of Attorney Robert Archie and Reverend Marion Bennett.

By contrast, the location is the same as before the name was changed. It is now known as the Nucleus Plaza Center. The building has a new facelift, a new landscape and 24-hour

security.

In the Nucleus Plaza Center the NAACP will, once again, be exposed to a high density of both foot and automobile traffic which is what the Branch wants.

The title of this column is, "The NAACP and YOU!", which means the NAACP can't do anything without you and the active participation of its members and friends.

I would be very pleased if a number of people would call me and volunteer their services to the Branch this week.
