### **MAJOR OBJECTIVES**

- A. Provide programs and activities which benefit lower income persons

- Prevent or reduce deterioration in designated neighborhoods.

  Preserve the existing housing stock and increase housing opportunities for lower income persons.

  Provide incentives for business expansion and stabilization in order to expand employment opportunities r lower income persons.

- Improve the public works infrastructure including street improvements in lower income areas.

  Develop neighborhood facilities to serve lower income areas.

  Provide housing/information services and further fair housing.

  Remove architectural barriers to the handicapped and increase opportunities for them to participate in
- Provide appropriate public services to assist lower income persons and agencies to meet client needs.
   In order to meet these objectives, the City of Las Vegas, by recommendation of the Citizens Advisory Review Board, proposes to utilize its 1985-86 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Funds from the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development for the following activities:

12. NEIGHBORHOOD COMMERCIAL REVITALIZATION

Activity will make available loan money to continue the provision of low interest loans with both short and long term amortization to create incentives for the full participation in the Jackson Avenue Commercial Revitalization Project and other CDBG targeted areas

14. COMPREHENSIVE HOUSING PROGRAMS POOR PEOPLE PULLING TOGETHER.....80,000.00 Provide comprehensive rental/multifamily housing services to low/moderate income persons residing in the CDBG targeted census tracted to maintain their place of residence. Services to be provided include tenant coun-

seling, landlord/tenant mediation, and social service assistance which supports low/moderate income persons.

15. FIRE EDUCATION & SAFETY PROGRAM CITY OF LAS VEGAS. 40,574.00

Reduce incidence of fire within the ten CDBG targeted census tracts through an intensive and aggressive fire safety and prevention educational program by surveying homes for smoke detectors and cleaning and replacing batteries as needed. This will be accomplished by hiring and training four low to moderate income or elderly persons.

16. CHILD CARE/PRE-SCHOOL PROGRAM NEVADA ASSOCIATION OF LATIN AMERICANS Provide no cost child care to families of low to moderate income who reside primarily in the ten CDBG targeted census tracted and provide job referrals/counseling, and subsistance to eligible clients.

NEVADA BLACK CHAMBER OF COMMERCE NEVADA BLACK CHAMBER OF COMMERCE. . . . 40,000.00 Provide technical assistance to fifty businesses in the targeted CDBG census tracts, and sponsor workshops on productivity, promotion/advertisements, business start-up, bonding and insurance, financing/accounting, and public relations to the business community and general public.

Over \$633,570.00 in CDBG monies have been spent to revitalize the housing stock in the ten targeted census tracts; improve and expand services to the physically and mentally handicapped; devise mechanisms to improve the level of health services available to low to moderate income residentse; decrease the isolation of lower income elderly and handicapped residents by providing low cost transporation to needed service centers; and, replace and rehabilitate dilapidated housing units for low income families.
