### STIRRING ADDRESS TO B-CON GRADS

B-Con (Black Community Organization network) of Greater Las Vegas observed another successful Baccalaureate and Awards Convocation on last Sunday evening in the spacious True Love Missionary Baptist Church.

A large gathering of local school administrators, parents, teachers and friends of the graduates heard a powerful address delivered

by the eloquent Dr. Cain Felder of Howard University School of Divinity. Dr. Felder's timely and scholarly address was centered around the topic 'The Struggle and Rewards for Black Excellence.' The following are excerpts from his speech:

Last week in Washington D.C. Howard University's Commencement Speaker was the Black poetess Maya Angelou, who began and ended simply with the words, "You are loved!" Her profound statement was addressed to the large hushed assembly of emerging black professionals and their families. In such a setting, her words were both timely and very well received, for we as a people need constantly to be reminded of the evidence all around us that WE ARE LOVED.....Those of you who are being honored here in Las Vegas today have shown earlier signs of being winners. Everybody seems to love a "winner"! In America we tend to place heavy emphasis on "getting ahead" and "winning", so much so that we often forget how easy it is to LOSE or how many "losers" there are in our midst, especially among Black Americans. After all, who wants to hear about the

team that lost, the high school student who dropped out, the juvenile delinquent, or the teenage parents who are ruining their lives before they have become adults? No, we tend to push the LOSERS into the background and glorify winning so much that "winning by any means necessary" becomes our ONLY goal. Thus, all too ofbecomes our ten today, people will lie, cheat, take short cuts, sabbotage the efforts of competitors, misrepresent themselves and pay bribes just in order to "win" ..... Such so-called winners make us all losers, whenever "get-ting-over" (expediency) is valued more than EX-

CELLENCE (quality).
''In 1978, the Russian novelist Alexander Solhenitsyn delivered the Commencement Address at Harvard University. He used the occasion to chastise America for our tendency to glorify technilogical achievements which do not redeem our moral poverty. He referred to America as an "abyss of human decadence", spoke about our "misuse of liberty" and warned us about setting the stage for "the triumph of mediocrity.

"We need to look again at the harsh realities of the Black crisis in America today. Not long ago, Roland B. Saunders wrote a two-part series for the PITTSBURGH COURIER, makling a number of observations about aspects of this Black crisis:

"'A Black person living in the ghetto has more opportunity and the likelihood is greater of being robbed, raped, mugged, brutalized and assaulted, than (others)...Homicide is the leading cause of death among Black males between the ages of 18 and 35 in which the vast majority of the crimes are being committed by Black males. The national

suicide rate for young Blacks has doubled in the last 10 years.....'

"Julius Wilson, a Black urban sociologist, showed that ten years ago, three times the percentage of Blacks, as compared to Whites, was below the low income between the ages of 14 and 34 and have become, in 1976, part of a "non-labor force," an underclass of an underclass of people not merely unemployed, but ипетployable.....If vast numbers of us are not unemployable, they are still unemployed, See SOCIAL, Page 7
