while pursuits that are designed to help eliminate juvenile delinquency.

One of the most satisfying and rewarding of Gamma Phi Delta's youth activities is the Phi-Teens. This group of teenage girls began as a pilot program of Phi Chapter in Anderson, Indiana. In 1970, the program was promoted to national status.

The Phi-Teens program epitomizes the sorority's aim of striving for refinement and culture which challenges each of these young women to attain her highest potential as she seeks to serve her family, her church and her community. Thus, Phi-Teens promotes the advancement to finer womanhood for each of its members. It also promotes the continual quest for knowledge and academic excellence.

The Rosebuds, named for the official flower of Gamma Phi Delta, promotes the early involvement of younger girls in a program of cultural enrichment. This program is structurally designed to develop skills and to enhance the scholastic opportunities of each young girl.

A Commission of National Youth Enrichment—consisting of the Supreme Basileus, National Youth Director, National Youth Enrichment Chairperson, a youth aide and all local chapter youth advisors—has been created to coordinate all of the sorority's youth activities.

The responsibilities of this commission include, but are not limited to:

- *Acquainting* youth with the fundamentals necessary to prevent and eradicate juvenile delinquency;
- *Encouraging* educational growth;
- *Promoting* refinement and culture;
- *Teaching* leadership techniques;
- *Encouraging* talent development.

Gamma Phi Delta's youth programs also encompass an organization for young men. The Junior Cavaliers became an official part of the sorority's youth auxiliary in 1975. The purposes of the group are four-fold:

1. To give young men a sense of direction and moral purpose;
2. To encourage educational achievement;
3. To promote refinement and culture;
4. To encourage each young man to work toward his own unique potential.

In this endeavor the sorors are ably assisted by the Cavaliers, an affiliate consisting of the husbands and other

men concerned with the aims and purposes of the sorority.

The granting of annual scholarships has been one of the ways in which Gamma Phi Delta has supported its members. (Continued on page 12.)
