

**Goynes gains impressive contribution pot**

**Seastrand leads candidates in building campaign war chest**

A total of \$42,690 has poured into the campaign coffers of Mayor James Seastrand this election season, putting him in the lead for contributions received by candidates for North Las Vegas elected offices.

Coming in second in contributions, but first in expenditures, is Municipal Judge Gary Davis, who has received \$37,752, but has spent \$45,336.

Seastrand so far has spent \$33,832 in his campaign against Larry Grubb, a perennial candidate who has received no contributions and has spent \$25 — the cost of filing for election.

Between April 13, the end of the first reporting period, and May 14 the mayor spent only \$1,112. He collected \$3,650 during that month, including \$200 from the Silver Nugget, a company that had given him \$400 earlier in the year.

Candidates are required to list the names of contributors who give them \$500 or more.

Davis' collection of

\$37,752 and expenditures of \$45,336 puts him far ahead of his only remaining opponent, Ray Daines, in both categories. Among Davis' contributions during the past month have been \$1,000 contributions from both Jackie Gaughan and Sahara Datsun.

So far, Daines, a former mayor and judge, has received \$10,579 in contributions. Among the contributions during the most recent reporting period were \$1,000 from Jerry's Nugget, \$1,000 from Christine Powell, \$700 from his daughter, Martha Daines, and \$500 from his daughter, Marcia Daines. He has spent \$16,218.

Sarah Lee Johnson, one of the two judicial candidates who was knocked out of the running in the May primary election, listed \$1,625 in contributions and \$3,312 in expenditures. The fourth candidate for judge, Larry Eckley, received \$65 in contributions and spent \$237.

Among the four candidates

for two City Council seats who made the primary cut, Councilman Theron Goynes is at the top of the money list with \$12,383 in contributions and \$11,247 in expenditures. Among his contributions during the past month was \$1,000 from Albert King of Inglewood, Calif.

Dale Huntsman, a former councilman, is next with \$7,846 in contributions and \$8,920 in expenditures.

Odell Davis reported receiving \$1,540 in contributions and spending \$2,050.

Vonne Chowning listed \$800 in contributions, including \$500 from the Police Officers Association. She spent \$4,275.

Among the three council candidates knocked out of the race, Anthony Gravanti was first in the money tally with \$4,110 in contributions and \$7,281 in expenditures.

Helen Pivoda received \$1,915 in contributions, while spending \$5,665. Margie Farley received no contributions, but spent \$87.93.

**LV Man Arrested In Bar Incident**

A 20-year-old Las Vegas man was arrested early last Thursday after he allegedly robbed a bar and fired a shot at the bartender, Metropolitan Police said.

Tyrone Collins, 900 H St., was arrested in the bathroom at 1101 Cunningham Drive by officers who had chased him from the corner of H Street and Monroe Avenue at 5:35 a.m., police said.

Officers were dispatched to Loves Cocktail Lounge, 500 Jackson Ave., after a report of a robbery.

Police said a man

reportedly had been fighting with the bartender and had gone behind the bar and pulled out a gun. During a struggle, the gun was discharged. However, no one was hit by the bullet and the bartender fled to another nearby bar to call police.

The robber allegedly took more than \$300 from the bar before leaving.

He was charged with robbery, using a deadly weapon in the commission of a crime, assault with a

deadly weapon, burglary and being an ex-felon in possession of a concealed firearm.
